With climate change, droughts and floods have increased in frequency and intensity in many Canadian communities. Water levels are unusually low on our peninsula this spring and summer and will be an ongoing environmental issue that we can all make attempts to address. Here is a detailed look at how to conserve water at home:

#### CONSIDER WATER SAVING FIXTURES:

Upgrade to low flow shower heads and dual or low flush toilets.

#### IN THE BATHROOM:

Take shorter showers or even cold showers -they're good for you.

Turn off the tap while brushing your teeth.

Hang towels to dry and reuse.

#### COLLECT RAINWATER:

Install a rain barrel for watering plants

Water your lawn wisely either in the early morning or late evening

Use mulch to reduce the need for frequent watering.

#### DISHWASHING:

Use a dishwasher (full loads only) rather than handwashing.
Use a bowl for washingcvegetables.

Reuse cooled cooking water forcwatering plants.

#### LAUNDRY:

Full loads only and shorter wash cycles whencpossible.

#### FIX LEAKS:

Check and repair any leaks in pipes, cfaucets, and toilets promptly. Toilet flappers are easily overlooked andare often the source of a leak that could easily empty a well. Don't forgetoutdoor taps and hoses.

#### **Hunting Seabirds**

In Trinity Bight, seabirds were an important source of fresh meat during the winter months. Hunting seabirds was not a sport. It was a necessity, because the birds supplied a much-needed source of protein at a time of the year when fresh meat was in short supply. The birds, mainly ducks and common murres, known as turrs in Newfoundland, were hunted from the shore and from open boats on the waters of Trinity Bay, using muskets in the early days, and later, shotguns.

There was significant risk of injury or death associated with hunting sea birds in small boats, especially before engines, when hunters depended entirely on rowing and sailing. There are many records of incidents in the Trinity Historical Society Archives. Here are a couple of examples.

On January 20<sup>th</sup>, 1818, Joseph Fowlow and two young brothers, Mark and John Peckham, ventured out into Trinity Bay to hunt turrs. When they had not returned before dark, and the night being very cold and stormy, all onshore presumed they had perished. Search parties found no trace of them over the next few days and the families were grief stricken over the tragic loss of their loved ones. However, 2 months later, Joseph Fowlow arrived back home from Hants Harbour, a town a mere 20 miles distance across Trinity Bay where he had been marooned. He said they had been out in Trinity Bay in their small open boat for two days and two nights before reaching land. Mark Peckham died on the second day, but John was alive and well in Hants Harbour. On a clear night the lights of the houses in Hants Harbour can be seen from Trinity, but in those days of winter isolation, no communication was possible to relieve the worry and bereavement of the grieving families.

Another story of the hazards of hunting seabirds occurred in the resettled community of Ireland's Eye, located 12 miles south of Trinity. Fred Toope, a WWI Navy Veteran, was out in Trinity Bay in the 1920s hunting turrs, when the musket he was firing exploded and blew off part of his hand. He was brought to Trinity by open motorboat where the doctor of the day amputated his arm above the wrist. After a few days, infection had set in, and the doctor amputated again just below the elbow. Luckily this time it healed. Fred made a living fishing in Ireland's Eye before resettling to Trinity in the 1950s, where he built a new house by himself, all with only one arm.

These are just a few of the stories featured in our new audio tour at the Trinity Museum. The tour relates people and events to displays at the Museum. # **Gordon Etheridge**




Gordon, the son of John Etheridge and Pricilla Batson, was born in Salmon Cove on June 2<sup>nd</sup>, 1892. He was a teacher before enlisting in the Newfoundland Regiment on September 28<sup>th</sup>, 1915. He was declared missing in action on July 1<sup>st</sup>, 1916. He was 24.

Gordon crossed the Atlantic onboard the liner Corsican and received military training in Scotland. He joined the regiment near Bonneville, France on April 4<sup>th</sup>, 1916. On July 1<sup>st</sup>, 1916 he was one of the 801 Newfoundlanders who went "over the top" at Beaumont-Hamel and he was later listed as missing in action. Only 68 regiment members answered the roll call the next morning. He has no known grave and is remembered on the Beaumont-Hamel Memorial, Beaumont-Hamel, France.
