The next snow day is a great time to take on some cleaning projects! Keeping appliances running in tip top shape is all about maintenance. Rangehoods are run by motors, fans, and filters all of which require regular cleaning to maintain their performance. Over time grease, dirt, and debris can build up and your range hood will not perform as well and may stop working all together. Clean your metal filter with hot water and a degreaser like Dawn dish detergent. Add some baking soda for a little extra cleaning power. If you have a charcoal filter, it is best to just replace the filter. Clean the blades of the fan with hot soapy water and check the airflow of the vent to insure it isn't restricted.

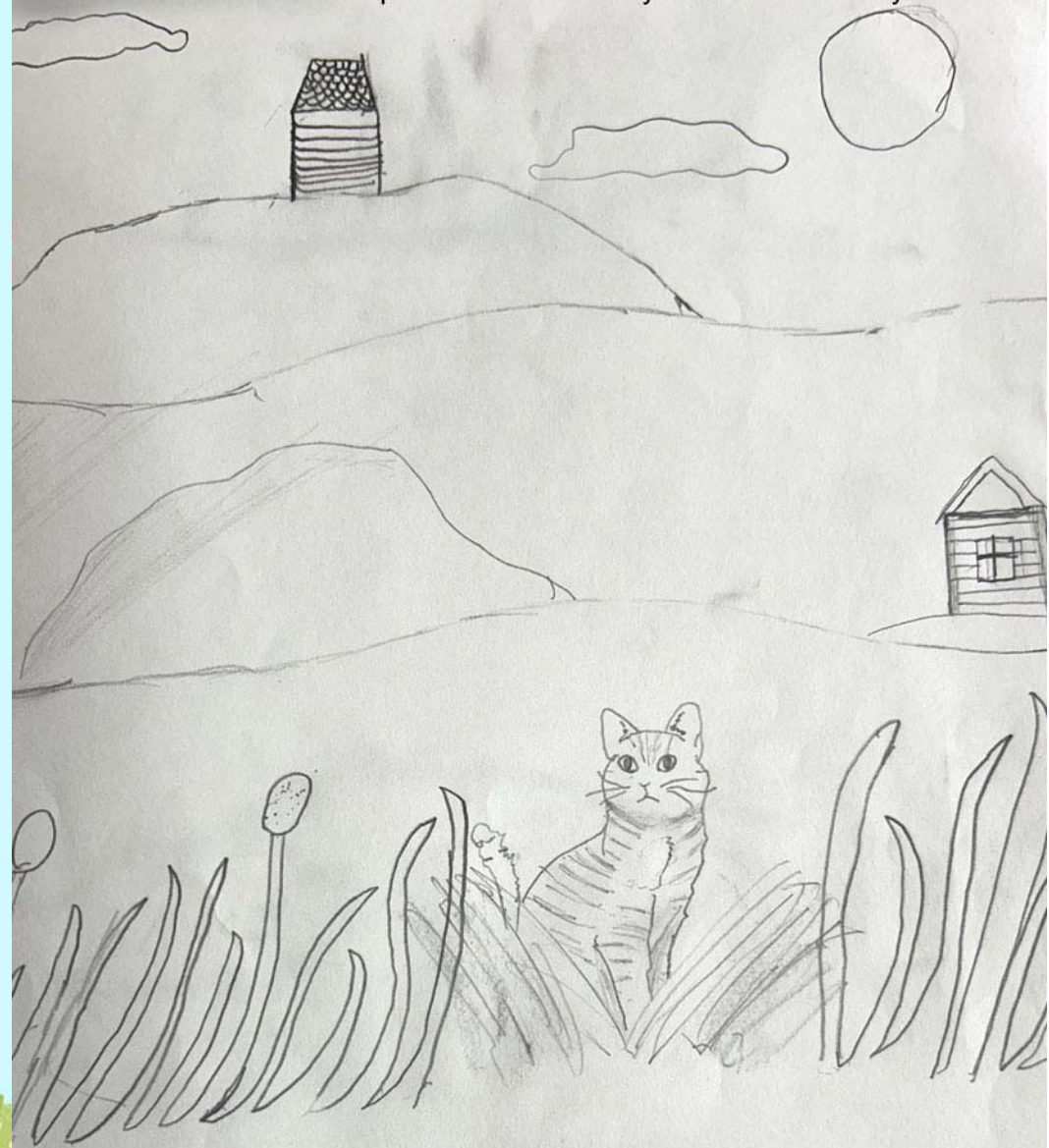

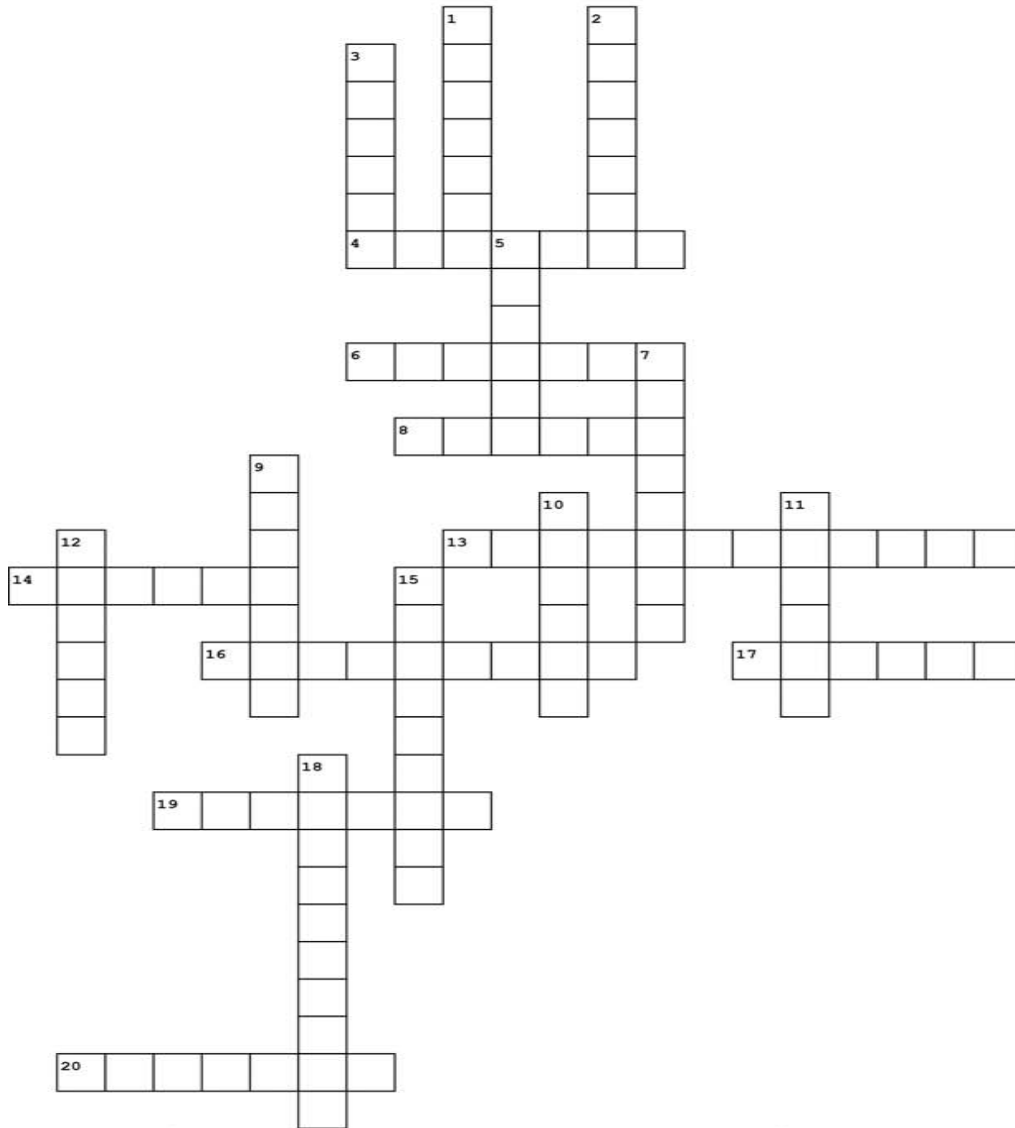

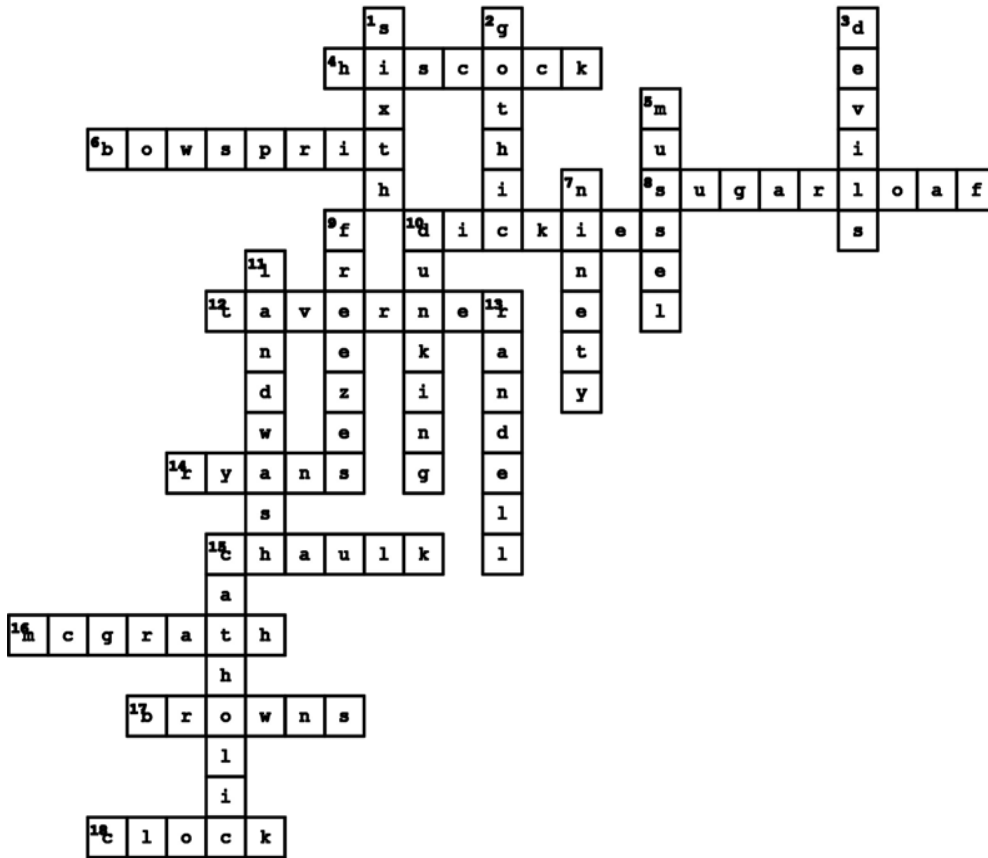

- be between the ages of 15-30;
- be legally entitled to work in the province and Canada;
- be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident or have refugee status in Canada; - not hold another job of 30 or more hours per week during the employment period.

Some grant programs will also require applicants to:

- be enrolled in high school (Level I, II or III) or a post-secondary institution in the 2024-2025 school calendar year; and
- be intending to return to school full-time in September 2025; or
- be graduating from Level III in June 2025 and planning to pursue an education at a post-secondary institution in September 2025.

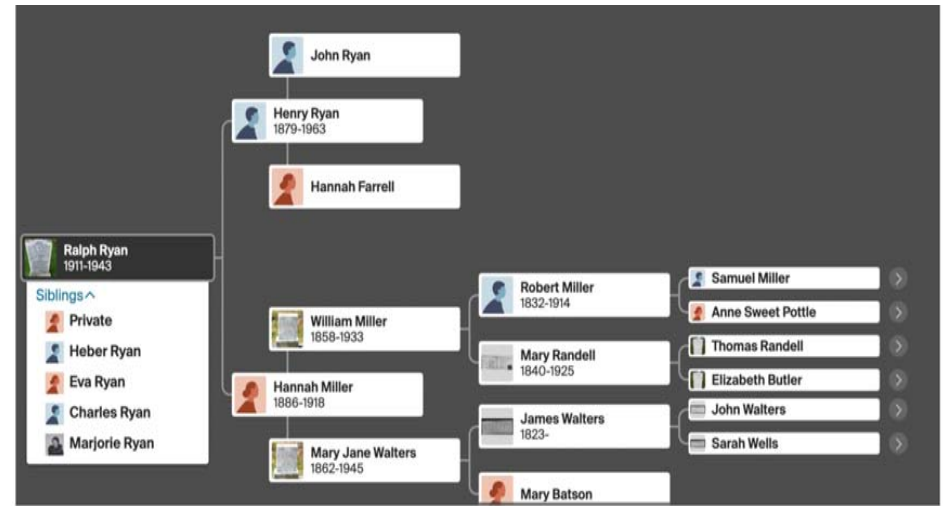

Family Tree

In the 1935 census, Ralph reported his occupation as fisherman, Labrador floater. He joined the Newfoundland Overseas Forestry Unit (NOFU) at the beginning of World War II (service # 1763) and traveled to Scotland on-board SS Chrobry in the winter of 1940. The NOFU supplied timber products critical to British coal mining which was central to Britain's war-time economy. The timber jacks cut wood by hand with bucksaw and axe. The work was hard and dangerous. Of approximately 3,600 men, 34 died and another 335 were invalided back to Newfoundland. Ralph died while in service in Scotland and is buried at Laggan Parish Churchyard, Invernesshire.

Ralph, the son of Henry Ryan and Hannah Miller, was born at Port Rexton on July 10th, 1911. He died on September 20th, 1943. He was 32.
