Zebulon Fowlow




Zebulon Fowlow, the son of Mathias Fowlow and Susannah Locke, was born at Pease Cove on July 30th, 1884. He enlisted in the Newfoundland Royal Navy Reserves on March 20th, 1903. He drowned accidentally on February 22nd, 1917. He was 32.



Family Tree

Zebulon was called to active duty in November 1915 and sailed overseas on-board the Cunard liner, Franconia. He served at naval bases Pembroke, Warfire, and President III before being assigned to SS Kilpano on January 31st, 1917. While returning to his ship on the night of February 22nd, 1917, Zebulon accidently fell into Albert Dock at Hull and drowned. He was buried with naval honours at Western Cemetery, Hull, England.
