In this edition of our Newsletter, we present the story of the third of the men who are remembered on the War Monument in Port Rexton.



## Ralph Randell



Ralph Randell, the son of John and Elizabeth Randell, was born at Port Rexton on October 5<sup>th</sup>, 1895. He enlisted in the Newfoundland Royal Navy Reserves on November 4<sup>th</sup>, 1914. He died in the sinking of the Clan MacNaughton on February 3<sup>rd</sup>, 1915. He was 19.

Ralph left St. John's for England on November 19<sup>th</sup>, 1914 onboard the liner Carthaginian. After a brief training period he was assigned to HMS Clan MacNaughton, an armed merchant cruiser, which sailed from Liverpool just before Christmas 1914 on patrol as part of the 10<sup>th</sup> Cruiser Squadron. The ship foundered in a severe storm west of the Hebrides on the night of February 2<sup>nd</sup>, 1915 with the loss of 20 officers and 261 crew. Ralph is remembered on the Beaumont Hamel Memorial, Beaumont Hamel, France.
