





#### The Trinity Bay Sealing Disaster

The inshore seal hunt played an important part in the lives of Newfoundlanders for centuries. Seals migrated south in the late winter and early spring and were hunted by residents of outport communities on the floating sea ice and in the water. The seals provided an important source of protein, and the pelts provided some cash.

There was significant risk of injury or death associated with hunting seals in small boats, especially before engines, when hunters depended entirely on rowing and sailing. There are many records of incidents in the Trinity Historical Archives.

The 27th of February 1892 was a calm Saturday in all the Trinity Bight communities when, using spy glasses, seals were spotted on the ice floes about five miles out in Trinity Bay. Men and boys jumped into their small boats, two to four in a boat, and rowed out for the hunt. Around 11:00 am, a sudden winter storm blew up with strong offshore winds and driving snow, and the sealers couldn't get back. Some crews rowed against the high winds for the nearest land, and after five hours of rowing arrived under the high vertical cliffs of the Horse Chops. Five men perished there before the rest were rescued by settlers from English Harbour. All the rest of the boats were blown out into Trinity Bay. Some boats made land around midnight at the towns of Hants Harbour and Old Perlican, after making it twenty miles across the Bay. Others got onshore on the north side of Trinity Bay at Trouty, Old Bonaventure, Ireland's Eye, and Thoroughfare. Some didn't get in at all.

There were two hundred and fifteen men and boys out from the Trinity Bight communities that morning, and twenty-five lost their lives. Seventeen of them were from English Harbour and nearby Green Bay which had a population of about one hundred and fifty people at the time. These seventeen who were lost in one day represented one third of the adult males from these two communities.

The social impact of the disaster was so extensive that a relief fund was put in place throughout the British Empire and a total of eighty-three hundred pounds were donated. Queen Victoria donated one hundred pounds. This money was used for pensions for widows and children who had lost their breadwinners, for elderly parents who had lost their young sons on whom they depended for their livelihood in their old age, and also for the families of men who survived this ordeal but were so severely frostbitten that they were unable to work afterwards.

This is just one of the stories included in our audio tour at the Trinity Museum. Visit the Museum and take a walk through history.

#### Gilbert Walters



Gilbert, the son of John Walters and Mary Courtney, was born at Salmon Cove on July 6<sup>th</sup>, 1886. He enlisted in the Newfoundland Regiment on December 14<sup>th</sup>, 1914 and was listed as missing in action on October 12<sup>th</sup>, 1916. He was 30.



Family Tree

Gilbert embarked for England on board SS Dominion in February 1915 and was transported to Edinburgh Castle, where he joined the regiment. He first saw action at Gallipoli in September 1915, where he became ill with typhoid fever and pyrexia. After a three-month hospitalization in Egypt, he was transferred to Wandsworth Hospital, London, England in December 1915. After recovery, he rejoined the regiment at Ypres, Belgium on September 8<sup>th</sup>, 1916. On October 12<sup>th</sup>, he went missing during the Battle of Gueudecourt, France and has no known grave. He is remembered on the Beaumont-Hamel Memorial, Beaumont-Hamel, France.
